Course Description

This course is an introduction to the basic skills in production and comprehension of American Sign Language (ASL). It includes the manual alphabet and numbers. Develops conversational ability, culturally appropriate behaviors and exposes students to ASL grammar.



Course Rationale

The purpose of this course is designed to help you develop the study skills you need to learn a language and to review and practice what you are learning in your language class. This may include lectures, small group activities, use of electronic media, and Deaf events. You will be encouraged to practice your receptive and expressive skills so that you can have a positive experience with your language course. Students are expected to come to class well prepared to participate in daily discussions. The grammatical explanations will be kept to a minimum and students will be required to work in pairs and small groups. Active participation in group work is required for the success of the class.

1. TRUE+WAY ASL (TWA) e-Workbook assignments 10%

This workbook is designed to retain and reinforce what is learned in the classroom. Complete the assigned workbook assignments by assigned due dates announced in the class. Late assignments will not be accepted.

2. TWA "SOAR" video assignments **10%**



The Self-Observation Assessment Review (SOAR) videos at the end of each unit in *TRUE+WAY ASL* e-Workbook website. You are to record your work via Canvas and submit your video by the due date. Late assignments will not be accepted.

3. Quizzes 20%:

Some quizzes will be announced in class and some will be "pop" quizzes. You may not make up any quizzes you miss – if you miss the quiz, you will get a zero. The quizzes will be based mainly on the ability to comprehend ASL and cultural information. Questions may also be drawn from the reading/viewing of the *TRUE+WAY ASL* e-workbook/video, video assignments, vocabulary, and class discussions.

4. Unit Tests: Comprehension & Production **30%**

Unit tests will cover all material presented to that point of the class. They will include information from quizzes, *TRUE+WAY ASL*, class notes, handouts, lectures, vocabulary videos, as well as your comprehension and production skills. There will be no make-up of the tests except under circumstances I deem to be extreme or unique.

5. Final Exam: Production **30%**

This expressive final will include comprehension and production, information from the workbook, videos shown in and out of class, vocabulary videos, class assignments, and discussions. There will be no make-up of the final exam except under circumstances I deem to be extreme or unique.

Assignments and submission guidelines

True + Way ASL (TWA) e-Workbook Assignment: This workbook is designed to retain and reinforce what is learned in the classroom. Complete the assigned workbook assignment by assigned due dates. Late assignment **will not be accepted** without medical (note from health care provider) or technical documentation.

TWA "Snapshots" Viewing Assignment: TWA snapshots is the place where you will view informative deaf culture, structure, linguistics, and topics. The snapshots will give you the background to prepare you for your class and assignments.

TWA Peer Observation Assessment (POA): TWA POA will have signed videos where you will need to discuss and analyze why it is wrong. This will allow you to become a reflective language learner. This needs to be done before your SOAR and tests.

TWA e-Workbook worksheets: These are the ASL virtual assignments that need to be done outside of your classroom to help you to prepare for your upcoming SOAR assignments and tests. No late assignments are accepted unless you have a medical note from your healthcare provider to receive an extension from your professors.

TWA "Conversation Starter & question": this part is where you can watch my lecture. Please look at your conversation starter discussion board with questions. You will sign your response in the **Canvas Discussion Board**. You will be assigned to a group of 4.



You will need to respond to at least two peers, but you are encouraged to interact with others if you find their posts helpful for you. You will need to post your work before you can respond to your peers' work. It is designed for you to post videos where you and your classmates can interact with each other. Please post and respond to at least two peers in your class.

TWA "SOAR" Video Assignment: The Self Observation Assessment Review (SOAR) videos at the end of each unit on *TRUE+WAY ASL* e-Workbook website. You are to record your work via Canvas and submit your individual video by the assigned due date. Late assignments <u>will not</u> be accepted unless you have a medical note from a health care provider to receive an extension from the professor.

TWA Quizzes: The quizzes will be based mainly on the ability to comprehend ASL and cultural information. ASL 1 Final Exam- This will be based on your ASL 1 where it covers from Unit 3. There will be **no make-up** of the final exam except under circumstances I deem to be extreme or unique.

ASL 1 Conversation Starter Discussion Board Post Expectations

- Your responses should be respectful and relevant. Remember, discussions are meant for you to explore the values of others which may differ from your own.
- You will need to post a thread before you respond to others.



- Pose any outstanding questions you still have after completing the reading response.
- Respond to your peers' questions regarding the readings.
- It is your responsibility to respond to classmates who do not yet have any comments.
- Your responses should be well thought out and enhance the understanding of all parties. A well-thought-out response is not " I totally agree with you," or "I have never thought of that before."
- To receive full credit, you will need to respond to at least two peers.

Netiquette Rules for Discussion and Emails Adapted from *Core Rules of "Netiquette"* by Virginia Shea <u>http://www.albion.com/netiquette/corerules.html</u>

- Rule 1: Remember that behind every post is a person. Treat your peers and professor with respect.
- Rule 2: Adhere to the same standards of behavior online that you would in person. Be courteous and use your manners.
- Rule 3: Know where you are in cyberspace. You are a University student completing an assignment for an academic class. Act accordingly.
- Rule 4: Respect other people's time and bandwidth. Use your discussion posts to meet the course objectives.
- Rule 5: Make yourself look good online. Your first impression is what you type.
- Rule 6: Share expert knowledge. Don't be afraid to share something you know a lot about.
