Dear Parents:

I am excited to be teaching English 10 this semester, and I look forward to working with each of you! Tenth grade English is designed to ensure a strong foundation in the analysis and study of world literature and writing.

Course Purpose and Content

Students will read and analyze a variety of prose fiction and nonfiction pieces in order to identify and appreciate theme, analyze the effective use of imaginative comparisons through figurative language, and recognize the complex development of characters and ideas. Instruction in writing and structured vocabulary studies will also be part of this course, with exploration of literary pieces serving as the launching pad for assignments.

Communication

You can expect to hear from me at the mid-point of the class by way of a progress report to be signed and returned. Your child will receive bonus points for returning it.

Email is generally the quickest way to reach me. Emails sent after 3 pm will likely be answered the following day during my planning time (see above for times).

We will read *Night* and *Julius Caesar* this year, and many assignments from those units will be accessed through the textbook. Assignment grades will be broken down in this manner:

To make it easier for students to calculate their average, all grades will be weighted the same. However, tests, projects, and most writing assignments will count as two grades, as well as any other assignments deemed appropriate by the teacher.

The grading scale is as follows:

Grading Procedures

Late work: A 20-point penalty is deducted for late work, meaning that the HIGHEST grade you will be able to receive on a late assignment is an 80. Please make sure you turn your work in on time.

If you are absent, you have one week from the date of your absence to make up any missing work. After that time, late points will be deducted.

Zeros: When I enter grades in Aspen, any grade missing for a student at that time will be entered as a "0" no matter the cause. A real time current average reflects how well a student is doing in class, gives the student greater assurance in their standing in class, and serves as motivation to submit any missing work that has been overlooked. Unless noted, however; it does not mean the grade will remain a zero.
