I am excited to be teaching English 10 this semester, and I look forward to working with each of you! Tenth grade English is designed to ensure a strong foundation in the analysis and study of world literature and the crafting of student-written essays.

Course Purpose and Content

Students will read and analyze a variety of prose fiction and nonfiction pieces in order to identify and appreciate theme, analyze the effective use of imaginative comparisons through figurative language, and recognize the complex development of characters and ideas. Instruction in writing and structured vocabulary studies will also be part of this course, with exploration of literary pieces serving as the launching pad for assignments.

Textbooks

McGraw Hill StudySync Grade 10

Many short stories, memoirs, essays, articles, and speeches will be taken from the *McGraw Hill StudySync* text. We will read *Night* and *Julius Caesar* this year along with several speeches and historical documents, and many assignments from those units will be accessed through the textbook. Textbooks are online, and novels will be viewable through links on Google Classroom if students do not receive copies. Please review this syllabus with a parent / guardian and then return the Agreement sheet. **Returning your signed syllabus will count as your first daily grade.**
