#### What We'll Learn

This course is designed to build on the reading and writing skills you developed in middle school. We'll focus on **close reading**, where you'll learn to analyze complex texts and understand an author's purpose, style, and point of view.

When it comes to writing, you'll practice creating arguments, writing narratives, and developing your own unique style. We'll also work on improving your grammar and vocabulary through our reading and writing assignments.

### **Key Texts and Films**

In this course, we will read from the *StudySync* curriculum and explore a variety of supplemental texts and media. While subject to change, our core literary works will include:

• Novel: The Odyssey

• Plays: Romeo and Juliet

- **Short Stories:** "The Most Dangerous Game" by Richard Connell, "The Scarlet Ibis" by James Hurst, "Marigolds" by Eugenia Collier
- **Graphic Novel:** *Maus* by Art Spiegelman
- Selected Works from StudySync: This will include a variety of poems and informational texts to complement our units.
