Things to Know:

- 1. Tests/quizzes will make up 40% of a student's grade, the remaining 60% will be from classwork/homework (daily grades).
- 2. Grades will be updated on Aspen weekly.
- 3. All assignments are to be turned in during class to a designated homework tray. Assignments turned in late will lose 10 points for each day they are late.

Rules and Procedures:
