# **Course Description**

Prerequisites: The courses currently called Primary Chorus, Music Appreciation, or Band must be completed and or individual study in piano or voice before registering for Secondary Chorus upon director approval.

General Education/High School Pathway Area: This course fulfills the requirement for a fine arts credit needed for graduation.

Fine Arts as your Program of Study: If you love my class or fine arts classes

at CCHS in general you can make this your program of study even if you don't want to make it your profession after high school.

Needs: Each choir member needs to bring in two boxes of store bought or homemade individually wrapped/bagged (snacks) for our Office Snack Sales at some point in the semester. Bottled water & tissue boxes are always welcome as well!

The choir classes at Cocke County High School are intended for students who have various levels of formal experience in singing. This class will cover fundamental vocal technique in both an individual and ensemble setting, as well as basic music notation, theory, and history. A variety of musical literature will be rehearsed during class, some of which may be performed on one of several upcoming concerts.

The CCHS Choral Department is dedicated to educating its members, student body and community of the professional, musical, and performance aspects of a choral ensemble. The students of the Choral Department must be devoted to learning professionalism (attitude, attendance, and cooperation), musicianship (music literacy, ensemble participation) and performance practices (stage presence). The CCHS Choir is to be excellent representatives of the department, school, and community. The stature of an ensemble is determined by the behavior of its members. Therefore, the expectation of upstanding behavior is extremely high.

## **Folder & Course Materials**

- Students will be provided with a music binder to be used during class and for at-home practice. Once issued, these folders and the music contained therein become YOUR responsibility.

- We will be using highlighters and colored pencils periodically

## **Performances and Rehearsals**

Because Chorus is a performance-based class, attendance in school, concerts and dress rehearsals are vital to the quality of the course. Students will not be excused from performance dates without a written excuse from their parent (illness, death in the family). If the director excuses the absence, a make-up assignment will be given which will be a 5 paragraph essay on a topic given at a later date. Athletes must complete a make up essay if they miss a performance because of an athletic event as well(this is just to be able to give a grade to each student in lieu of missing the concert).

Attendance and participation at rehearsals and concerts is mandatory. Proper concert etiquette is required, including not leaving a concert until its conclusion. Absentees receive a 10% grade deduction for an unexcused rehearsal and a 20% deduction for an unexcused performance. Students with an excused absence

### **Rehearsal Procedures**

One must be a participant, not a spectator, in order to really understand it and be successful in it. Participation is part of the grading procedure. **Active participation** in all aspects of the daily rehearsal includes:

- Being ready to start class with folder in hand **before** the bell rings (not in the bathroom or walking through the door)
- Starting class as a team with stretches & warm-ups when the time is appropriate
- Not having your phone or digital device out during class since they will be stored in the phone pockets in class
- Getting rid of all food, gum, etc. before rehearsal
- Focusing on the person who is speaking or singing
- Demonstrating good singing posture
- Not talking when the director is actively rehearsing
- Making sure you have a pencil during every rehearsal in order to mark music
- Following directions from the director or whoever is leading
- Leaving personal problems outside the choir room (HUGE ONE)
- Everyone will make mistakes and no one is perfect (including Mrs. Short!) Let's be each other's greatest supporters and confidence

boosters!

 The choir classroom is a safe place to be! Please always abide by your class contract and be respectful and courteous of others!

These factors are basic to the formation of a good choir. They are not what is necessary to be an 'A' student – they are the minimum expectation of any choir member, anywhere. Grade points are assigned for each of the above skills or requirements for a successful and prosperous choir environment.

## **Graded Course Activities**

#### **Viewing Grades in ASPEN**

Points you receive for graded activities will be posted to the ASPEN Grade Book. Click on the My Grades link on the left navigation to view your points. Your assignments will be scored and updated in Aspen in a timely fashion. Please allow at least two weeks after an assignment has been complete in order for a grade to be entered.

## **Letter Grade Assignment**

Final grades assigned for this course will be based on the percentage of total points earned and are assigned as follows:

Your grade will be determined by three factors: 1) your attendance and participation and procedure compliance in rehearsal 2) completion of assigned written work in class or as homework, and 3) periodic performance assessments. These may consist of music currently being learned, sight-reading, or a combination of the two.

#### The grading formula that will be used is listed below:

\*\*Every student starts out with 100 participation points per 4 ½ weeks. If each choir member is doing their very best to follow all rules & rehearsal/performance procedures, each student will receive full credit for participation. If procedures & daily procedures are not followed, each warning whether verbal or written will result in the loss of participation points for that term. The restroom is not used as a "hang out" spot and certainly not during class time. Use the restroom before class starts, before you leave the main building to come to the choir room, or at the end of class.
